Protecting your privacy is very important to us. Our goal is to treat the personal information you furnish us with the utmost respect and in accordance with this Privacy Policy. We request that you carefully read this Privacy Policy and our Terms of Use before using the website. By visiting, viewing or using the website in any manner, you are agreeing to the terms set forth in this Privacy Policy, as well as the Terms of Use for the website.

This policy describes the types of personally identifiable information (“PII”) and nonpublic personal information (“NPI”) we may collect from you or that you may provide when you visit our website and our practices for collecting, using, maintaining, protecting and disclosing that information. PII may include information such as your name, social security number, address, phone number, ZIP code, email address and similar information. For clients, we also collect and maintain NPI, which includes information you provide to us in connection with obtaining financial products or services, information about your transactions with us or others, and information we receive from third parties such as custodians, brokers, or other service providers.

Client Privacy Notice (Regulation S-P)

This notice is provided in accordance with Regulation S-P and applies to current and former clients of the firm. It describes our practices regarding the collection, use, and disclosure of nonpublic personal information (“NPI”).

Personal Information We Collect and How We Collect It

You can visit us on the internet without telling us who you are or revealing any information about yourself, including your email address. In this case, our web servers may collect the name of the domain you used to access the internet (such as aol.com) and the website you came from and visit next. This information is used by us and our business partners to measure the number of visits, average time spent, page views and other statistics about visitors to our website in general. Accessing or Correcting Your Information

If you believe that an error has been made in the accuracy of the information collected from you, we will correct such error upon adequate verification of the error and the identity of the person seeking the correction.

Please understand that to protect your privacy and security, we may also need to take reasonable steps to verify your identity before granting access or making corrections.

Sharing Information

We do not disclose nonpublic personal information about our clients or former clients to nonaffiliated third parties, except as permitted by law. For purposes of this notice, “affiliates” means companies related by common ownership or control. These permitted disclosures include, for example:

- To service providers that assist us in operating our business (e.g., custodians, technology providers, compliance consultants)
- To regulatory authorities or as required by law
- To protect against fraud or unauthorized transactions

We do not sell your personal information to third parties.

Opt-Out Rights

Because we only share information as permitted by law, clients do not have the right to opt out of these disclosures.

Website Privacy Practices (Non-Client Users)

If you are browsing, a cookie is used to help us measure the number of visits, average time spent, page views and other statistics relating to our website. This cookie, by itself, does not reveal to us your email address or who you are. If you decide to register online with us, we may collect additional information to provide tailored offerings or content to you. In this case, we use cookies to recognize you on subsequent visits and make your online experience more convenient.

Cookies are small pieces of data stored by your internet browser on your computer's hard drive. They cannot be used to collect data from your hard drive, obtain your email address or personal identifying information about you. Handling of ‘Do Not Track’ Signals
